





Water Leaks

Could your increase be the result of more water consumption?

The summer months can increase your water usage. Use of pools, irrigation of lawns and gardens, washing your car, and visits from out of town family and friends can all have a significant impact on your water consumption. According to the American Water Works Association (AWWA), water use can increase by as much as 50% in the summer months.

Do you have a dripping faucet?

Based on the size of a leak, the table below illustrates the water waste you *could* experience...

Diameter of Stream	Gallons Wasted (1-month period)
 1/4 inch	393,833
 3/16 inch	222,000
 1/8 inch	98,667
 1/16 inch	24,667

Calculations based upon 60 psi water pressure

Leaks can come from many places in your home, which could include but are not limited to your toilets (**MOST COMMON**), water heater, faucets, outside water sprinklers, water service line, etc..
